# September 2022 Annual Financial Audit Review -Background

- The NCTCOG as fiscal agent for the District has an annual audit of its financial statements performed by an independent accounting firm.
- The NCTCOG procures its independent audit firm every five (5) years.
- Whitley Penn is the C.P.A. firm that performed the FY 2022 audit.
- Field work is typically completed by the audit staff from September to December each
  year and the final audit report is issued by mid-February.
- Audit results are presented to the NCT9-1-1 Board of Managers in March.



## September 2022 Annual Financial Audit-Audit Standards

- The audit is performed in accordance with Government Auditing Standards (GAS).
- Audit both the financial statements and federal financial assistance.
- The audit process is a risk-based approach in which samples are selected to identify potential areas of risk that could lead to material misstatements of the financial statements. Potential items to be reviewed could include:
  - > Internal audit reports
  - Cost allocations plans
  - > Financial Transactions
  - > Staff Interviews
  - > Policies and Procedures



## September 2022 Annual Financial Audit-Audit Results

      - No internal control findings
      - No findings related to compliance

# NCT9-1-1 Item 7: Quarterly Financial Report

## December 2022 Financial Status Report-Background

- December represents three (3) months of fiscal year 2023.
- Target represents one-fourth (1/4) of fiscal year 2023 budget.



## December 2022 Financial Status Report-Summary

- Revenue total \$2.8 million or 100% of the three (3) month target of \$2.8 million.
- Expenses total \$3.0 million or 108% of the three (3) month target of \$2.8 million.



## December 2022 Financial Status Report-Revenue

- Revenue totaled \$2.8 million for the three (3) months or 100% of target.
  - ➤ Wireless revenue totaled 100% of target for the three months totaling \$2.4 million.
  - ➤ Landline revenue totaled 98% of target for the three months totaling \$400 thousand.
  - > Other revenue totaled \$6,000 for the three months.



## December 2022 Financial Status Report - Expenses

- Expenses totaled \$3.0 million for the three (3) months or 108% of target.
  - ➤ Staff costs totaled \$1.1 million for the three (3) months or 78% of the three-month target.
    - ❖ Below target due to two (2) unfilled staff positions
    - Travel below target for the three (3) months. Travel budget increased in fiscal year 2023. Expenses expected to increase during the fiscal year.
  - Cost of Operations totaled \$1.9 million or 142% of target.
    - Primarily due to one-time software maintenance payments.



# December 2022 Financial Status Report – NG9-1-1 Grant

- Revenue and expenses total \$1.4 million
- Grant accepted at September 2022 Board meeting.
- Grant continues until December 2024
- Capital replacement fund balance to "back stop" expenses until reimbursed by CSEC (as authorized by Board in FY 2023 Budget).

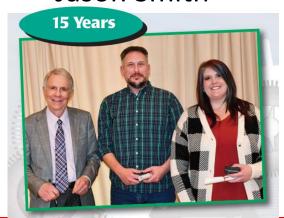
